

John C. Krieg, former superintendent of Licking County Children's home and one of Newark's early shoe dealers, died Saturday at 4 p. m. in Newark hospital. He observed his 90th birthday anniversary last Oct. 25.

Mr. Krieg had been a patient in the hospital since Sept. 28, receiving treatment for a broken hip suffered the day before in a fall.

He was a native of Baltimore, Md., born Oct. 25, 1857, the son of William and Mary (Martel) Krieg, and came to Newark in 1878 and engaged in the shoe business. He later was head of the Children's home for 12 years and retired in 1923.

Mr. Krieg was a member of the First Methodist church and also of Newark lodge, F&AM.

He leaves two sons and three daughters: Lawrence M. Krieg of Newark, and Harold C. Krieg of Columbus, Mrs. H. S. Bauman of Newark, Mrs. L. C. Eckberg of Plymouth, Mass., and Miss Dorothy V. Krieg of Altadena, Calif.; also two sisters, Miss Ella V. Krieg of Buckeystown, Md., and Mrs. Rufus Reed of Bethesda, Md.; three grandchildren. His wife, the former Etta M. Montgomery, preceded him in death in 1932.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 10 a.m. in the Gutliph and Henderson funeral home conducted by Rev. Joel M. Wareing. Burial will be made in Cedar Hill cemetery.
