Dear Mrs. Middleton:-

On the 8th of Spt. my friend Dunlop left for NYork where he is working now, and I asked him to get in touch with you and keep me posted about Philinda. He wrote some time ago stating he had been unable to locate you at your old address in Scotland Road, Orange. He also expressed his opinion that you had moved in the meantime. And so I requested him to get in contact with Mr. Campbell and investigate your new address. So far he has not replied to this and as I'm tired of waiting I take the liberty of writing you through Mr. Campbell, although I hate to disturb him.

I did not wire Philinda at Bordeaux for I did not get your letter until the 18th. of Sept. when I thought she would have gone. I do not [sic] what to think - If she is back home, I cannot figure her reasons for not writing me. Even if she is still over in Europe, why is that she has not yet written? Maybe the answer is that she does not care. The whole affair is troubling me so much I cannot concentrate my mind fully on my business. Some times I get an overwhelming desire to leave every thing and go to Europe to get her back and when I realize how powerless I am I fall into a state of despair which is going to break down my resistance. I guess this is a sort of confidence. How I regret not having being in US last June as I was going to ... to prevent her going to France. I am afraid there is no use repenting now.

If you ever come to meet my friend and partner Jim Dunlop he will be able to picture me at length. He may be able to describe me just the way I am, with my defects and my strong character. Beforehand I approve of everything he may say.

There is one thing you were kind enough to tell me in your letter of Sep. 11th. that I am understanding. I am going to refute this for I am not understanding, unfortunately. I am as Mr. Campbell says: Very dominating. But one can be dominating and tolerant at the same time, thus balancing one thing with the other. And I am learning to be tolerant.

Thank you so very much for the contents of your letter. It touched my heart. I hope I will go to live to N. York in the near future and then it is possible you will know me better and form a more accurate opinion of me.
