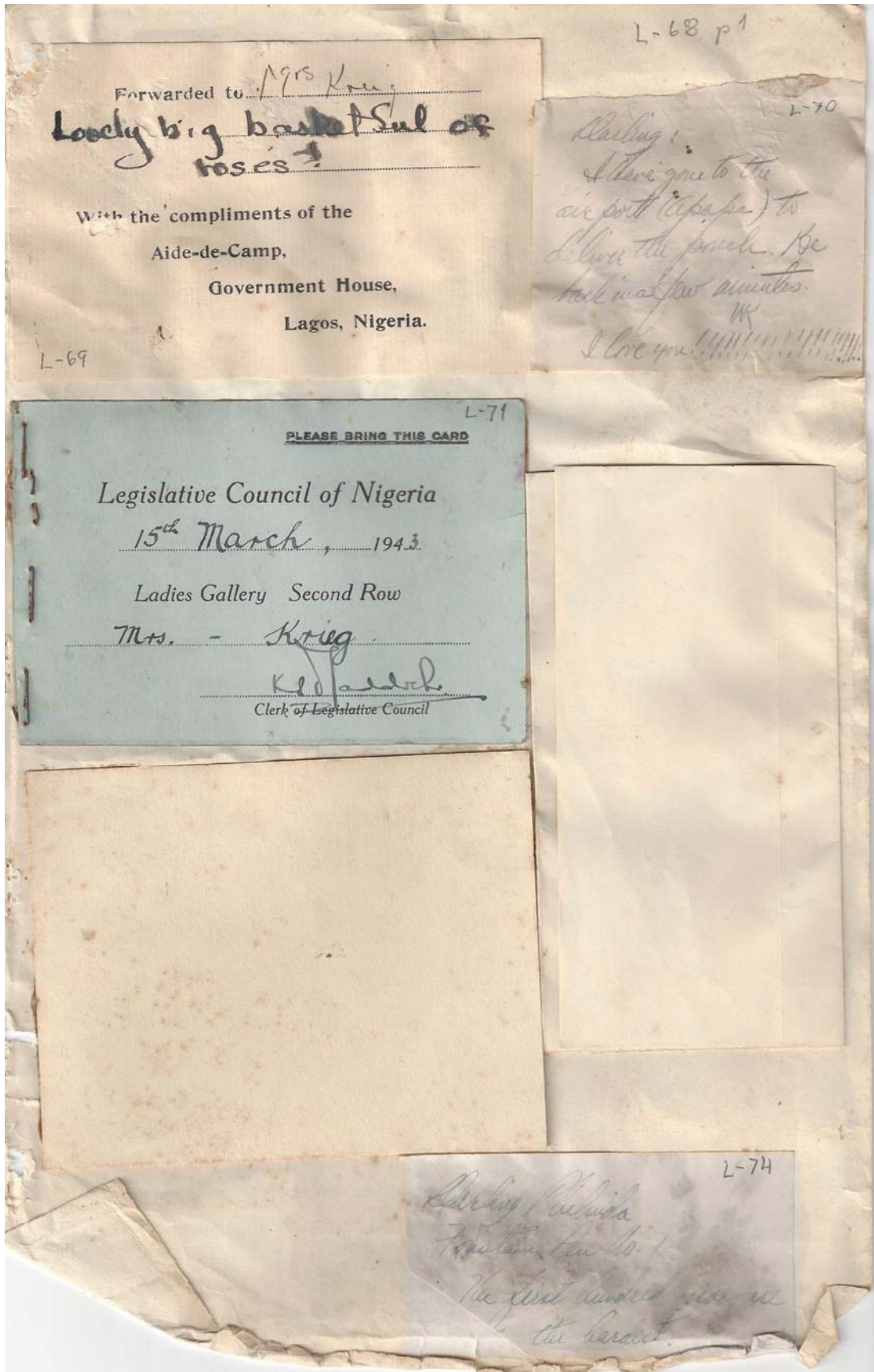
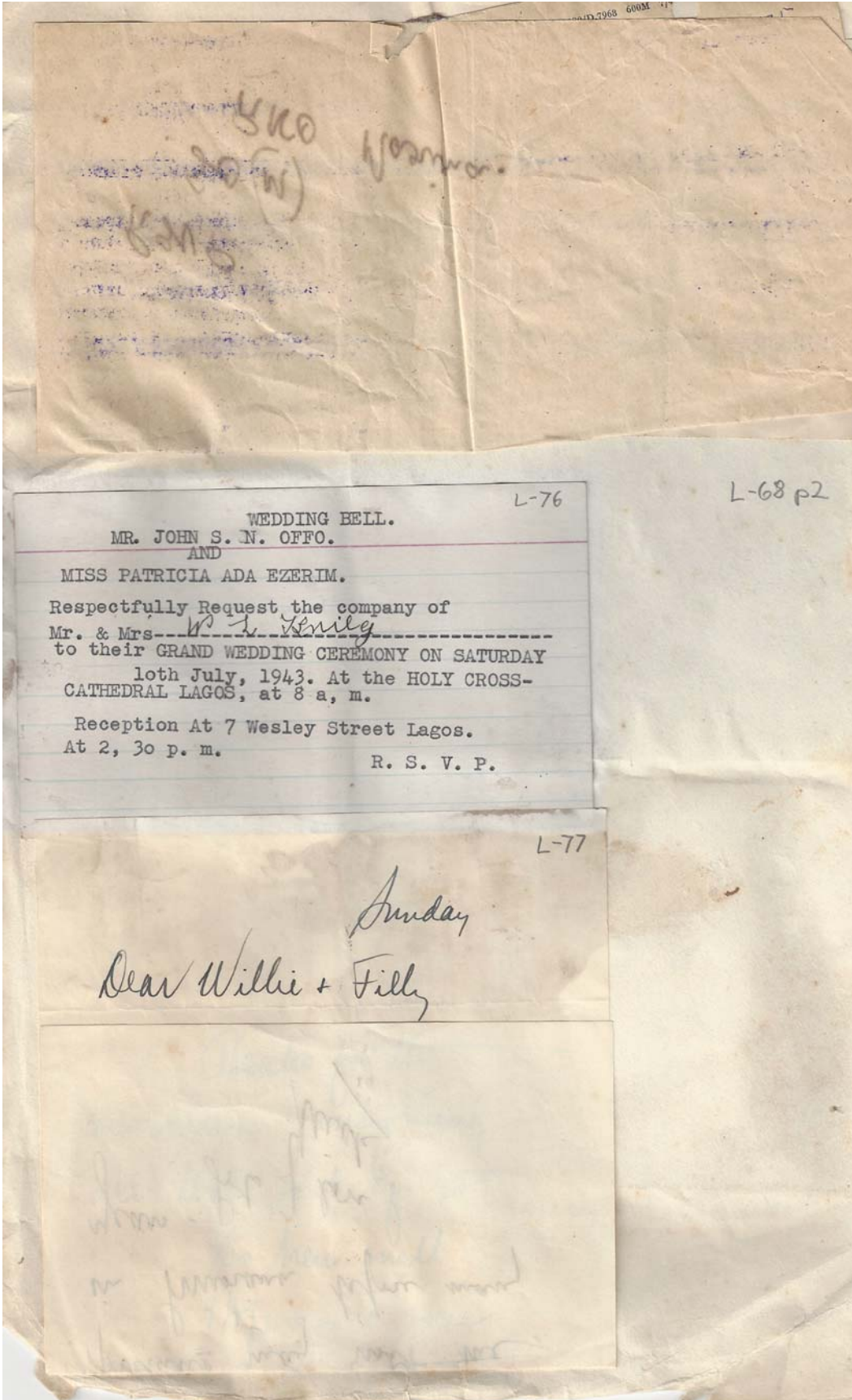


Dear Mrs. Krieg,

I have received your very appealing letter regarding your lamp shade and the total resources of this Department will, I assure you, be combined to remedy the unfortunate fault which has become apparent in manufacture.

A long time ago, long before my time, somebody started to make frames for lamp shades. They were designed in two parts consisting of (1) the frame which formed the shade and (2) the wire structure, technically known as the "gallery" on which the lamp shade balanced, more or less successfully. Hence the two parts. Anyhow, I am repairing the ring at the bottom of the gallery and replacing your own skilful engineering job by one of solid tinkering.

We do hope that the result will be satisfactory.
