

ABOUT THE KRIEG-CAMPBELL FAMILY RECORDS

This is part of a series of online documents based on the letters, papers, and photos of William Laurence Krieg (WLK) and Laura Philinda Campbell Krieg (LPK). Most were stored in the bottom drawer of WLK's desk in Sarasota, Florida, at the time of his death. I (Laurence John Krieg) was named Executor in the Last Will and Testaments of WLK and of LPK, so it has been my responsibility to do something with them.

William and Philinda led interesting lives before and after they married. William was a Foreign Service Officer from 1938 to 1972 - a diplomat representing the United States of America in Stuttgart, Germany; Milan, Italy; Lagos, Nigeria; Caracas, Venezuela; Guatemala City, Guatemala; and Santiago, Chile. Philinda had lived in Paris before they met, from 1939 to 1941. They each wrote extensively to their families with accounts of living overseas in interesting times, and received accounts of life at home. Many of the letters and photos are mundane accounts of daily living and social life, of interest primarily to family members, but the backdrop is a fascinating glimpse of the times and places in which they lived.

It seemed obvious to me that these records deserve better than to remain tucked away in drawers. They are worth making available to other family members, of course; but also to any others who may have interest in the historical details. The catch is that there are well over two thousand pages of documents and countless photos. Careful digitizing is a time-consuming process - one which I am unlikely to complete in my lifetime. So I offer what I can, with the hope that it will be of general interest.

THE LAGOS PERIOD, 1941-1944

William and Philinda met in July, 1941, in Lisbon, Portugal. William had been evacuated from his post in Italy, and Philinda from her situation in France, when the United States severed diplomatic ties with Italy and Germany. They fell deeply in love and agreed to marry, but first Philinda had to return to the United States to dissolve her first marriage, and William received orders that sent him to Nigeria.

Letters and photos from the end of 1941 to their return to the U.S. in early 1944 are included in the "Lagos Period" even though between November, 1941, and February, 1943, Philinda was not in Nigeria. So although most of the photos are of Nigeria, there are a few taken while Philinda was in Miami, Florida, where she worked with Pan American Airways System.

I have included the comments written by WLK and LPK on the backs of many of the photos, transcribing them verbatim in most cases. Some of these reveal attitudes that were prevalent at the time, but which might now be considered insensitive. They are included to provide historical and cultural evidence of the spirit of the times. During that period, Nigeria was a British imperial colony. About the time WLK arrived, the United States entered World War II as an ally of Britain. Nigeria became an important staging area for military operations in North Africa, so many of the photos include British, Canadian, and American military personnel in a social setting. There is also a set of photos from northern Nigeria taken by Americans of the Office of War Information (OWI) depicting cultural ceremonies.

#### **TECHNICAL DETAILS**

Most of the photos are black and white or sepia prints 100 x 76 mm (4 x 3 inches). These snapshots were scanned at 600 dpi for high resolution detail, but the digital results are not always what I had hoped for, especially in the "close-ups". The major exceptions are the OWI photos, whose prints are 255 x 205 mm (10 x 8 inches); these I scanned at 300 dpi, and these digitized very satisfactorily.



# Beauties Lend Helping Hand To Pan American Passengers

# Pretty Girls Meet Planes, Smooth Out Problems

A helping hand—and a lovely one—has been extended to travelers at the aerial gateway between the Americas at Miami.

The feminine touch has been added by comely passenger service representatives in trim, navy blue uniforms whose aim is to make arrivals and departures just as smooth as the passengers' swift flight through the clouds.

Travelers — even the veteran globe trotters—often find themselves with some last-minute detail overlooked, especially in international travel with its additional problems of public health, immigration and customs inspections.

Helping passengers with these problems and the many others certain to come up is the task assigned to the newly-created corps of passenger service representatives now greeting Pan American Airways passengers at the Miami airports.

Carefully selected for poise, tact, personality, looks and linguistic ability, the representatives provide information and act as interpreters.

Generally that covers their duties, but they're on hand to help the passenger in any way that will make arrival or departure as easy as possible. They mind the baby while mother goes through customs inspection, extend a helping arm to the infirm, make hotel reservations and telephone calls, dispatch telegrams and relieve the passengers of countless other little details.

Resourceful and efficient, the girls are trained to solve almost any problem a passenger might present. This is especially important on departures, for it eliminates many difficulties that might delay a Clipper's scheduled takeoff.

The girls are on hand to meet all passengers—ranging from royalty and diplomats to little junior traveling alone. They can easily converse with any of them in English, Spanish, Portuguese or French,


With passenger service representatives now on duty in Miami, others are being trained by Pan American for some of the other major terminals of the Eastern division's vast network of air routes between the Americas.





Because WLK and LPK traveled in February, one of the two routes shown in blue would have been taken. During a 2010 conversation, WLK indicated that the plane made an overnight stop "somewhere on the west coast of Africa" - presumably Bathurst (now Banjul, Gambia) where passengers were accommodated in a hotel. That would indicate that the plane continued to Lisbon, the Azores, and Bermuda.

Terminus of the route was Baltimore, Maryland, where WLK and LPK were met by Philinda's father John W. Campbell, Sr., and her step-mother Helen Putnam Campbell.





Figure 19 Boeing 314 routes
