Chapter 19. Concluding Thoughts

Nwehu Nuswei (NN) verbs do not express person, number, gender, or any other information about the nouns to which they related, though this is common in many languages. Instead, NN has a very rich set of pronouns, and articles available for use in various ways to help ensure discourse connectivity.

Doing this work is a set of 3,840 words arranged in 15 genuses, providing a variety of referential and syntactic options for efficiently tying the words of a sentence to the concepts deemed important or helpful by a speaker.
